- Born 27 July, 1960 in Bristol, UK
- Ranked Number 1 in Great Britain from 1982-84, 1986-87, and 1990
- Won the mixed doubles at Wimbledon in 1987 and at the Australian Open in 1991, both with Jeremy Bates
- Won the singles at Mahwah and Sydney in 1983
- Won the doubles at Singapore in 1990, and the German Open, Boston and Mahwah in 1983
- Was a singles finalist at Newport in 1990, Brighton in 1983, Greenville in 1982, and Beckenham in 1980
- Reached the semi-finals at the French Open and the US Open in 1983 and the quarter-finals at Wimbledon and the Australian Open in 1984
- Represented Britain in the Wightman Cup in 1979, and 1981-89, the Federation Cup from 1981-1987 and 1989-1993, and the European Cup from 1989-1992
- British National Singles Champion in 1983, 1984, 1986, 1987, 1990, 1991, 1992; Doubles winner from 1983-1987, and 1989-1992
- Recorded two career wins over Steffi Graf, Zina Garrison Jackson, Anke Huber, Pam Shriver, Tracy Austin, Hana Mandlikova, Claudia Kohde-Kilsch, Yvonne Vermaak, Helena Sukova, Nathalie Tauziat, and Katerina Maleeva and others
- Career prize money \$1.2 million; Highest singles ranking 5 (January 1984)
- Underwent back surgery in December 1980 and knee surgery in 1993
- Retired at Wimbledon in 1996
- Now working for the Lawn Tennis Association as an advisory coach
- Enjoys pasta, a glass of wine and snow skiing in Switzerland
- Lives in Winchmore Hill, North London
